## Mission Opportunity In Ecuador

Come and hear about a transforming way to do God's work in the beautiful jungles of Ecuador! This ministry, Jungle Kids for Christ, was started several years ago and is spreading the Gospel through a school that will eventually be K-12. The children are provided with a Christ centered education that will enable them to grow in their relationship with God and also provide a top grade education to enable them to reach their full potential in the work place.

We will depart on Thursday afternoon, September 24, 2015, and return early in the morning on Saturday, October 3, 2015. A typical day in the jungle begins with light work or maintenance projects followed in the afternoon with VBS with the kids. After dinner, we meet for devotional time.

Our home in the jungle is a hostel that is operated by fellow Christians who provide excellent meals and very clean accommodations. The individual rooms are spartan, but adequate for our needs.

The purpose of the meeting is explain the ministry and to review the trip itinerary and activities. The team leader is Gary Gotfredson who has led eight other teams to this ministry site. These teams consisted of youth and adults of all ages.

## The Privilege of Sharing

As we consider together our theme for this year's stewardship campaign, "The Privilege of Sharing" and our theme passage, 2 Corinthians 8 & 9, there is a word that seems to me to demand our attention. It is right there in 2 Corinthians 9:8 – **SUFFICIENCY**. Our dictionary defines this word as "enough or an adequate amount." But, as we look closely at this passage, there seems to be much more to it than that. This short verse describes the God kind of **sufficiency**, and tells us that from that **sufficiency** we have enough -- an adequate amount to ABOUND to every good work. That conveys a rather different image than simply "enough."

Our many Committees have prayerfully labored over their budget submissions for the coming year. As we review these plans we will see many opportunities to do this abounding thing. We may even be tempted to wonder how we can possibly respond to such a challenge. I believe the answer lies in an understanding of our **sufficiency**. Paul references this earlier in 2 Corinthians 3:5, pointing out that "our **sufficiency** is from God." The Macedonians understood this well and, it guided their decisions. As they caught the vision of what God was doing, they responded enthusiastically to participate in realizing that vision. **Today, as God's people we have the very real privilege to be a part of what God is doing in His Church, His/our community and His world. As we pray together during this campaign, may we seek to understand what our role should be in His plan, rather than how much we can afford. Let's look forward to seeing all the amazing things God will do that we can be part of in this coming year. "God is able!"**
