RESPOND TO PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS

Daily we hear about the atrocities of ISIS perpetrated on untold men, women, and children in their path of destruction. We are especially cut to the heart when we learn of the martyrdom, not only of our adult Christian sisters and brothers, but even of their innocent children-little ones who though of tender years so love Jesus that they would choose to suffer horrible death rather than betray our Savior.

In the face of such evil we often feel paralyzed as to how to respond. Of course prayer is our first refuge in such a desperate situation but through modern technology there is an avenue to reach out to persecuted Christians throughout the world. That contact point is Voice of the Martyrs (www.voiceofthemartyrs.com).

Pastor Richard Wurmbbrand started Voice of the Martyrs in 1967. He had been in prison 14 years, 30 feet below ground in Communist Romania for his faith in Christ. He had little food, no light, and was beaten every day. He had no Bible. When he was finally released from prison, he was dismayed to learn how little support there was among the nations for those Christians suffering so severely. He spent the rest of his life establishing a network to assist persecuted Christians.

Today, through Voice of the Martyrs, we can send letters of encouragement to specific fellow Christians who are imprisoned. Amazingly, the website translates Bible verses of your choosing into the recipient's own language. Sometimes such letters result in better treatment for prisoners. We can also send Action Packs-essential clothes and health care needs-to persecuted Christians in a number of countries or send donations to missionaries in dangerous circumstances. In addition there is a blanket ministry through which we can send a blanket and a Bible to persecuted Christians in the Sudan.

From the comfort and safety we enjoy let us quickly reach out to our imprisoned Christian brothers and sisters with love and direct support. As we are urged in Hebrews 13:3 may we:

"Remember the prisoners as if chained with them, and those who are mistreated, since you yourselves are in the body also."
