



This painting by Eugene Burnand is one of my favorites. It seems to capture the amazement and exhilaration of John and Peter running to the tomb upon hearing of the resurrection of Jesus. I note the focus of their movement. It is fixed and deliberate. John is slightly ahead of Peter in the painting. It almost depicts what Peter and John must have been thinking, "Can it be true? We remember Him saying many things about rising on the third day---is this actually happening?"

Burnand was a deeply committed Christian. One of his biographers wrote, "For him (Burnand) his faith and his art were life-giving powers, and the source of all his development, the inspiration of all his work. His greatest desire was that those who saw his pictures should attain a closer fellowship with the living God."

The story is told of a woman who went to see Dwight L. Moody and to hear him preach. She was most interested in the psychology of revival and wanted to study the man. After the service, she was asked what she thought of Moody. Looking up in surprise, she said, "I forgot what he said. I went, intending to study him, but became so interested in his message that I forgot to study him. I lost Moody, but I found God."

The eagerness and expectancy of Peter and John in Burnand's painting are seen in every line of face and body. Eagerness and expectancy. When worship is filled with those attitudes of heart and mind, we find God. Hallelujah! Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed!
