From the Senior Chaplain

We're looking forward to resuming the Wednesday Fellowship activities on September 10. It is a wonderful opportunity for us to come together mid-week to share a meal, worship, pray, and study God's word. I hope you will join us as often as you are able.

An opportunity included in the Wednesday Fellowship will be a Bible study from 4:30pm until 5:40pm. It is a 30-week / 3-semester study entitled, "Christian Believer." This study was developed in 1999 and has been used in churches around the world. It covers the major doctrines and theological emphases that are embraced by orthodox Christianity.

"Christian Believer" was developed by Dr. J. Ellsworth Kalas. Dr. Kalas served as a pastor for 38 years in Wisconsin and Ohio. He also served as president of Asbury Theological Seminary. Dr. Kalas obtained his Bachelor of Science at University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1951; his Bachelor of Divinity Degree at Garrett Theological Seminary in 1954 and did additional graduate studies at University of Wisconsin-Madison (1954-1955) and Harvard University (1955-1956). Dr. Kalas also holds honorary degrees from Lawrence University, Asbury Theological Seminary, and Kentucky Wesleyan College. He has authored over 35 books and many additional published articles.

The Wednesday Fellowship Bible study will take us through November 2015. The same study manual will be used in all three semesters. I think you will find it a valuable resource even after the Bible study has concluded. We will be looking at studies on Providence, Salvation, Atonement, Faith, Trinity, and many more.

A sign up sheet will be available in the church office as well as the opportunity to order a study manual. I hope you will find the time to be with us on Wednesday afternoons for "Christian Believer." And then I hope you will join everyone for the delicious meal followed by a 30-minute Vespers service in the sanctuary.

Big Canoe Chapel Women's Guild invites all women of Big Canoe and the surrounding communities to its September 11th meeting at **10:00 AM in the Broyles Center. "God's Extravagant Grace" is the title** of the presentation by Kim Lewis, Director of Pregnancy and Mentoring at Bartow Family Resources. She has served as Director of External Development and Communication for the Women's League Bible Study Ministry and recently received her certificate as an Internationally Board Certified Biblical Counselor. **Kim's passion and purpose are to equip women to understand and apply God's word to their lives and circumstances.** Guild members are asked to bring donations to this meeting of disposable diapers (sizes 4, 5, 6), wipes in refill packs, or cans of dry baby formula to help support the pregnancy center.

Ladies Bible Study will begin on Wednesday, September 3, and will meet every Wednesday in McCormick Hall from 9:30 until 11:45, with an optional prayer time before at 8:30. This 12-week study will end before Thanksgiving with the last meeting on November 19. **"Jesus the One and Only" by Beth Moore is an in-depth women's Bible study of the life of Jesus based on the book of Luke.** It will include weekly personal assignments and 11 video sessions taped on location in Jerusalem and throughout Israel as well as small group discussions. Sign up at Stand-Around today or next Sunday, or contact Glenda Mitchell or Chris Twiss to sign up. The cost of the book is \$17 and may be purchased at Stand-Around or on the first day of class.

"Following in the Footsteps of the Reformation"-The next Chapel Pilgrimage, scheduled for October 24 through November 5, 2015, will be an exploration of the 1517 reformation, Church history surrounding the reformation, the reformers themselves, and many of the places in Switzerland, France, and Germany where we can trace the footsteps of the reformers themselves. We explore the thinking of Martin Luther, John Calvin, Jan Hus, and Ulrich Zwingli and the ensuing reformed theologies that came out of the Reformation (Lutherans, Calvinists, Reformers, Anabaptists). We will begin our pilgrimage in Zurich, continue with a trip up the Rhine River from Basel to Amsterdam, with lectures on the documents that came out of the Reformation by guest lecturer Maxie Dunnam, Methodist minister, author of several dozen books, and recent editor of *The Upper Room*. We will be amazed at how we at Big Canoe Chapel have been formed and informed by this movement, and how, through those documents that came out of the Reformation, we have all been able to come back together serving One Lord. Brochures are available in the Chapel Office. Rev. Lamar Helms will hold an informational meeting in the Chapel on Sunday, September 14, at 11:45 am.
