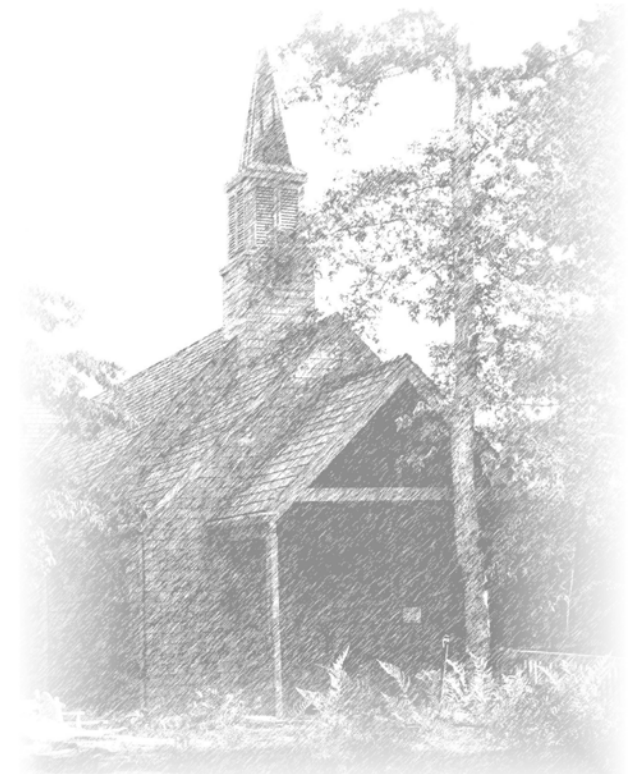

A Transformative Journey

In May 2014, twenty-nine of us set off on a pilgrimage to Ireland. We call the trip a pilgrimage--a transformative journey to a sacred center. Pilgrimages speak to our longing for meaning and purpose. As we gave our attention to the land called Ireland, its people, and their faith, we became more aware of who we are and what we believe.

The land was beautiful, even in barren places like The Burren or the Giant's Causeway. The people were warm and welcoming, offering to help in any way they could. It is no wonder that this would be the place John Wesley would be drawn to after he felt his own heart "strangely warmed."

We were fascinated by the stories of St. Patrick, who was at one time enslaved in Ireland, escaped, then returned to bring the inhabitants to God. Today we focus on parades, wearing green, and leprechauns, but his was actually a very spiritual experience as he tried to bring the Irish from their pagan beliefs to belief in the One True God using the high crosses to elucidate the scriptures.

Following the life and influences on C.S. Lewis, Christian apologist and prolific writer, helped us see the impact other people can have on our lives and we on theirs. Sandy Smith, biographer, credits Lewis with offering "a reasoned argument that dealt with the big questions but retained a belief in the God of historic Christianity."

Of course the most notable quality that has been characteristic of all our pilgrimages is the sense of community that develops among the pilgrims. Sharing the varied experiences with folks we do not know well deepens the travel as well as the friendships. But is this not true for our life's journey, especially our Christian pilgrimage, where Jesus sends us out into the world to be His hands and feet?
