### "Following in the Footsteps of the Reformation"

#### Chapel Pilgrimage 2015: Oct. 28—Nov. 5

The next Chapel Pilgrimage will be an exploration of the 1517 Reformation, Church history surrounding the reformation, the reformers themselves, and many of the places in Switzerland, France, and Germany where we can trace the footsteps of the reformers themselves. We explore the thinking of Martin Luther, John Calvin, Jan Hus, and Ulrich Zwingli and the ensuing reformed theologies that came out of the Reformation (Lutherans, Calvinists, Reformers, Anabaptists). We will begin our pilgrimage in Zurich, continue with a trip up the Rhine River from Basel to Amsterdam, with lectures on the documents that came out of the Reformation by guest lecturer Maxie Dunnam, Methodist minister, author of several dozen books, and recent editor of The Upper Room. We will be amazed at how we at Big Canoe Chapel have been formed and informed by this movement, and how, through those documents that came out of the Reformation, we have all been able to come back together serving One Lord.

## From the Senior Chaplain

Someone recently shared with me this devotional by Mary Jane Clark. I thought it was worth passing along.

*About 30 miles north of Nairobi, Kenya, is a small community called Kijabe, the Place of the Winds. It is perched on the escarpment wall overlooking the Great Rift Valley. When I lived in East Africa, one of my assignments was to write about the work at the mission hospital there for donors in the United States. The views from Kijabe are extraordinary, and I always enjoyed my visits there.*

*One afternoon the nursing director and I were trying to concentrate on a quiet task together when the wind became particularly gusty, blowing our papers around. “Wind can be so unsettling,” I remarked as Norma got up to close the windows.*

*“Yes, but I think maybe that’s its job here on Earth—to rearrange things,” she replied. With the windows closed we were nearly oblivious to the wind. It howled around the buildings as we carried on with our task.*

*Later, thinking about what Norma had said, I remembered how the Holy Spirit came with the sound of the wind at Pentecost. The Spirit came to rearrange people’s lives, changing their priorities and reordering history. For the people who were there, nothing was ever the same again.*
