From the Senior Chaplain

A number of years ago I came across this illustration from a book entitled, [Evangelism in Perspective](#). I believe it captures the urgency of the task before us.

An artist painted a picture in which he sought to depict the nature of God's salvation. A small boat was being crushed by a violent storm. Black clouds filled the sky. The flashing lightning and angry waters spelled certain death for the seamen. In the forefront of the picture was a large rock. One of the seamen was holding on to the rock with all his might. The title of the picture was, "Rock of Ages." True to the Scriptures, the artist captured the assurance that we have a shelter in the time of the storm.

The artist reflected upon his work and realized he had not accurately communicated his subject. So he painted another scene similar to the first.

There was the same storm, the black clouds, the flashing lightning and the angry waters. There was the same little boat crushed against the breakers and the crew vainly struggling in the waves. In the forefront was the same large rock and the same seaman holding on for salvation. But the artist made one significant change. The survivor was holding on with only one hand; with the other, he was reaching down beneath the waves to lift up a sinking friend.

Isn't that the New Testament picture of evangelism? It is the hand reaching down to rescue the lost and the least. Until that hand is offered, there is no message---and there is no salvation.

We have good news to share. There is a shelter in the midst of the storm. There is hope in the most difficult time. Lord, help us to always be the people extending the hand of Christ.
