

Mission Emphasis

No Longer Bound began as a halfway house and has grown into a drug and alcohol program for adult males over age 18. They provide job training and an opportunity for men to learn how to take responsibility for their own recovery and to adopt an entirely different lifestyle. Located in Cumming, they have greenhouses, auto and woodworking shops and job training on their campus. There is also a printing business and a food pantry supporting people in Forsyth County. Recently a Thrift Store in downtown Cumming was opened. Big Canoe Chapel's funding is used to support the Food Ministry, including the cost of vehicles used for daily pickups, and feeding the residents three meals a day for 10 months. They have recently expanded their ministry to Bremen, GA which will house 80 drug and alcohol patients. Their focus is not just a man's sobriety, but making him a disciple of Jesus Christ.

Today's speaker is Edward Bailey. Edward came to No Longer Bound in 2004 in desperate need of hope and healing. His life was controlled by an addiction to drugs. He found the healing power of Christ at work at NLB. After graduating from the program, he was trained for another 10 months in servant leadership and now serves as the Director of Operations. He has been married for 4 years to his college sweetheart, Jennifer, whom he met at Lee University.
