From the Senior Chaplain

Someone recently shared with me an article on Viktor Frankl. Perhaps you are familiar with him. He was a prominent Jewish psychiatrist and neurologist in Vienna who survived a Nazi concentration camp. When liberated in 1945, most of his family perished including his pregnant wife. In 1946 Frankl published his best-selling book, Man's Search for Meaning. As the result of his concentration camp experience and observing the behavior of his fellow prisoners, Frankl made an observation that served as the thesis of his book. Meaning was the difference between those who **lived and those who died**. Within the book is Frankl's famous quote, "The man who knows the 'why' for his existence will be able to bear almost any 'how.'"

In 1941 Frankl applied for a visa to America that was granted. The Nazis had started rounding up Jews and Frankl knew that it was only a matter of time before his parents would be arrested. He was newly married with a visa in hand. The hope and freedom of America beckoned. What would he do?

One day he set out to St. Stephan's Cathedral simply to listen and reflect on his excruciating decision. Should parents be left behind? Is America the answer? His biographer wrote that he was looking for a "hint from heaven."

When he returned home he had his answer. A piece of marble was recovered from the rubble of a nearby synagogue destroyed by the Nazis. His father had placed it on a table. It contained a fragment of one of the Ten Commandments—Honor thy father and thy mother. Frankl remained in Vienna and the full meaning of his life unfolded in the next four years.

I trust Lent is for you a time of quietness and reflection. As you pray, study God's word, meditate and listen for His "still, small voice" you will surely discover a "hint from heaven." It will communicate meaning for your life and strength for your spirit. Listen closely. He is speaking.
