Christmas Blessing Program

Big Canoe elves will once again share the spirit of Christmas with families and foster children in Dawson and Pickens Counties

In years past, this program has been sponsored exclusively by the Chapel and has brought Christmas Blessings to many needy families and children in Pickens and Dawson Counties. In 2012, the Christmas Blessing program served over 40 neighboring families and 98 children, thereby positively impacting over 156 lives.

Due to current economic conditions, participation and support of this program is being extended to the total Big Canoe Community (not just Chapel members). For those not familiar with this program, it is a coordinated effort with various agencies in Dawson and Pickens counties to identify those families and foster children in the greatest need. The agencies provide us with their family or foster children's general information including their Christmas shopping needs. We will then match up Big Canoe shoppers who, at their own expense, purchase gifts for the families and foster children, with a tax deductible donation form to be provided. We partner these Christmas gifts with food gift cards and have volunteer drivers drop off these Christmas goodies either to the families or to the appropriate DFACS office. This is a wonderful way to celebrate Christmas and provide much needed assistance to our Pickens and Dawson County neighbors.
