In Genesis 3:15, God places Adam in the Garden of Eden, telling him to “dress the garden and keep it.” Here in Big Canoe we surely live surrounded by the beauty of nature, but as we appreciate this beauty we also recognize our responsibility to be good stewards of the Earth.

Over the past five years, Big Canoe has been increasingly effective in recycling trash. Not only has this kept a significant percentage of our garbage out of landfills, it has saved Big Canoe property owners thousands of dollars as well! In support of this community-wide effort, the Chapel has been increasing its emphasis on recycling. The office staff members, in particular, have been diligent in their efforts at recycling the inevitable paper waste that is generated.

Now it is time to expand our recycling efforts even further. In order to increase recycling awareness, you’ll start to see “RECYCLING COACHES” at Stand-Around and the Wednesday Fellowship. In addition, we are transitioning to recyclable plates and cups.

Also, please look for the blue recycle baskets next to the regular trash cans throughout the Chapel and Broyles Center and put only recyclable items (such as paper or empty water bottles) in these baskets.

Note: Styrofoam cups, plates, etc. are NOT recyclable in our present system so please put these items in trash containers and not in the blue baskets. Finally, please do not put liquids in the blue recycle baskets.

As we all work together, we can do even more in this much-needed effort!
