From the Senior Chaplain

Legacies seem to be important. Presidents want to leave a legacy of positive accomplishments that will be remembered and admired for many generations. However, even the least and most common person wants to be remembered for something noble and worthwhile that has been accomplished for the good of humanity. It may be something as simple as kindness expressed to a child or a meal served to a family grieving over the loss of a loved one. Usually, **people don't forget sincere and genuine acts of grace. And I believe it's** the kind of legacy that truly pleases the Father.

In this space several weeks ago I mentioned C.T. Studd. After the service Ray Bedingfield reminded me of a poem written by Studd entitled, **“Only One Life.” It had been years since I read the poem and I** was thankful to receive a copy from Ray. Studd was extremely wealthy and as an athlete had the stature of a Michael Jordan throughout Great Britain. He gave away all his wealth and went to Africa as a missionary. The opening lines of **“Only One Life”** read:

*“Two little lines I heard one day, Traveling along life's busy way;
Bringing conviction to my heart, And from my mind would not depart;
Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.
Only one life, yes only one, Soon will its fleeting hours be done;
Then, in 'that day' my Lord to meet, And stand before His Judgment seat;
Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.”*

I stand before you today, on Father's Day 2014, reminded of someone's legacy that affected my life forever. Shortly before his death, my Dad was visited by a friend and colleague by the name of Fred Shelnett. Both my Dad and Fred served as pastors of Smyrna First United Methodist Church. I found the Smyrna church bulletin from 1975 in which Fred recounted his visit with my Dad. Fred said, **“Roland told me if he had to do it all over again, he would still invest his life in the ministry of the Kingdom.”**
