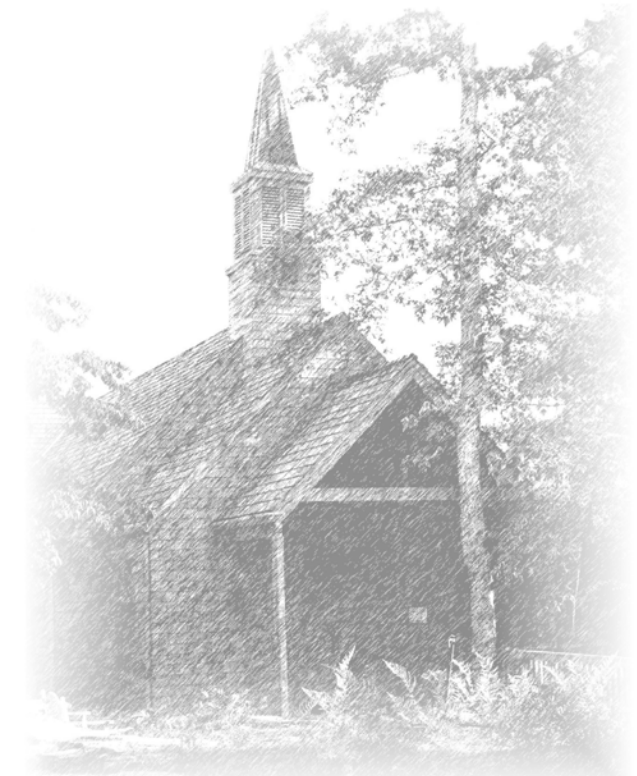

From the Senior Chaplain

Of all our national holidays, I don't believe there is one more somber or solemn than Memorial Day. We tend to take far too many things for granted and our freedom as Americans certainly falls into that category. We are gathered today in **freedom of worship because someone's son or daughter made a sacrifice to preserve that freedom.** I am often reminded of **the teaching of Jesus in John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."** I trust you will spend time in prayer thanking God for heroes who have gone before us so that we can live in the blessing of freedom. I recall a portion of a speech made by President John F. Kennedy in which he said, **"The cost of freedom is high but Americans have always paid it."** It makes me wonder about the price to be paid in the years to come. Such a prospect of war, suffering, and death should cause the church to pray long and hard for God's peace to prevail.

Charles Kingsley was a priest in the Church of England during the 19th century. He selected the words for his tombstone: **Amavimus, Amamus, Amabimus. It means, "We have loved, we do love, we shall love."** Let us not forget the One who laid down His life so that love would reign throughout eternity. Because of the sacrifice of Christ for a sinner such as I, there is a peace that transcends all the understanding of the world and a love that will not let me go. Kingsley reminds me that the love of God known in this life will not be erased by death.

"Father, hold our heroes in your arms throughout eternity. Thank you for such a joy and peace that is complete. Enable us to live in gratitude for freedom. Make us instruments of your peace. Amen."
