Scout Sunday at Big Canoe Chapel

Today is Scout Sunday at Big Canoe Chapel and throughout the USA. On this day we recognize the youth of the Boys Scouts of America and adult Scouting leaders for their contribution toward the development of boys into becoming responsible, trustworthy, helpful and reverent citizens of our nation.

Boy Scouting was founded in 1907 in Great Britain and spread to America in February 1910. It has the three-fold aim of development of Character, Citizenship and Fitness. The mission is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law. Boy Scouting is available for boys in 6th grade through age 17, and Cub Scouting is available for boys in kindergarten through fifth grade.

Since the fall of 1999 when the Chapel's Scouting program was organized, it has had the privilege of leading 19 youth to the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest rank in Scouting. This is no small feat given that only 4% of all Scouts reach the rank of Eagle. Our most recent Eagle Scout is Sam Peagler – achieving the rank of Eagle Scout this January.

Our Cub Scout Pack 20, with over 27 Cubs, has experienced significant growth over the last couple of years – **making the Chapel's support** that much more important to the success of the program.

All members of the Chapel's Scouting units want to express our sincere thanks to the Chapel as our sponsor organization.
