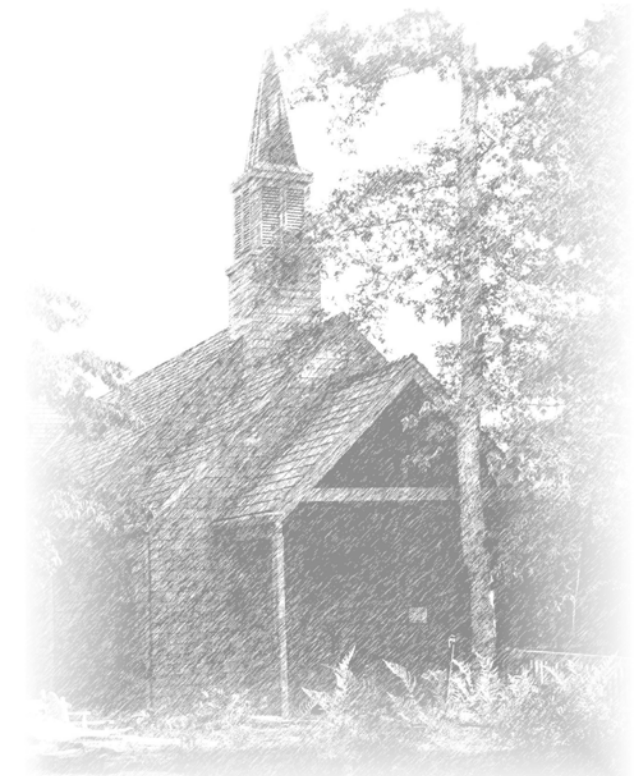

From the Senior Chaplain

C.T. Studd was a well-known missionary to Africa. Prior to his call in ministry he was probably the most prominent athlete in Great Britain. I love the story of how he trusted God so completely. It is unforgettable. Dennis Kinlaw shares it in his devotional book, [This Day With The Master.](#)

Studd and his missionary team lived deep in the interior of Africa and mail only came every two weeks. Their survival depended upon that money. Studd was a master of ceremonies at opening the mail and he made it quite a ritual.

One delivery brought a substantial amount of money. **Studd's comment was, "Bless God forever! He knows what a bunch of grumblers we are. He has sent us enough to keep us quiet." Shortly thereafter, the amount was quite small. Studd exclaimed, "Hallelujah! We must be growing in grace. He thinks we are learning to trust Him."** Another delivery brought nothing. The missionaries gathered around Studd wondering what he would say. They were not disappointed. He lifted his voice in a shout, **"Hallelujah! Praise God forever! We are in the Kingdom already, for in the Kingdom there is neither eating nor drinking, but righteousness, joy, and peace in the Holy Ghost."**

Sounds a bit reckless doesn't it? But don't you think such a faith was pleasing unto God because Studd dared to expect God to be faithful in all His promises? Can you look back and see the undeserved goodness of the Father in your life? Try it. Write them down. Remember the goodness of God. His track record is very good.
