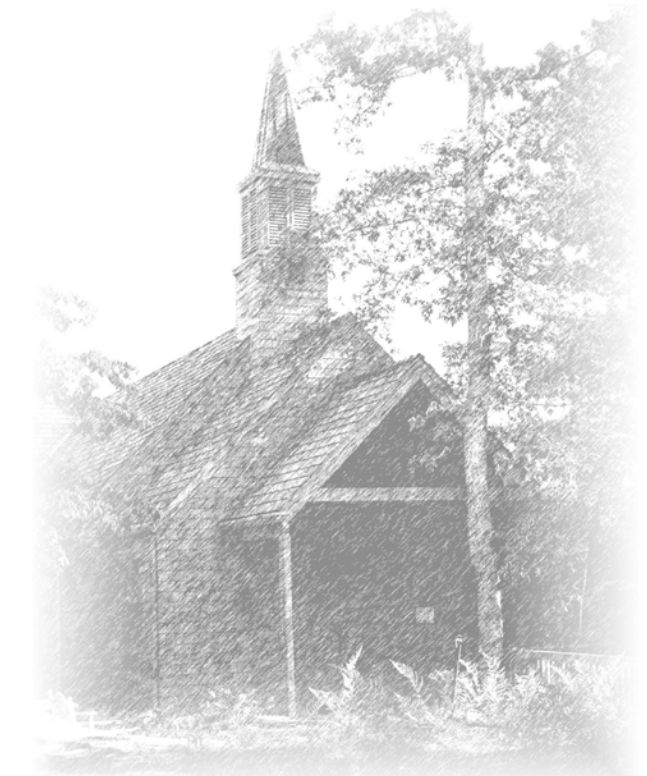

About Eagle Ranch

Eagle Ranch is one of Georgia's largest homes for children in crisis, serving North Georgia and Metro Atlanta since 1985. The Christ-centered program provides a home, counseling and education for nearly 70 boys and girls on a 270-acre campus located in Chestnut Mountain.

Children who come to Eagle Ranch are in family situations that necessitate them living elsewhere until those family issues are resolved. Our goal of reunifying the child with his or her family is facilitated through individual and family counseling.

Children are referred to the Ranch from sources such as schools, private therapists, individuals, churches, and community-based organizations, as well as the Department of Family and Children Services and Department of Juvenile Justice.

Eagle Ranch has six homes for up to 42 boys and four homes for up to 24 girls. An on-campus SACS-accredited school works with students in grades 6 through 12. The most recent addition to our campus is **a barn to be used for the Ranch's equine therapy program. Children enjoy athletic fields, a pool, gym, playgrounds and wooded trails.** More than a thousand children have spent a season of their lives at Eagle Ranch.

Eagle Ranch is a member of the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA) and has been debt-free since its inception; no construction or development takes place until all funds are secured. Funding is provided entirely through private donations from concerned individuals, churches, civic clubs, corporations, and foundations. Our annual operating budget for 2014 is \$3.7 million.
